

Different ways of storing information Lesson Plan: Class 03 / IP / 02



Goal of the lesson: To make the children understand the ways by which information can be stored and the benefits of the same.

Procedure Details

- 1. Start the class by asking the question what do they understand about the word information?
- 2. Ask them different questions.
- 3. Tell them that they were able to get to get some information about something from the answers to the questions asked
- 4. Ask them why they need information.
- 5. The questions given in slide 4 can be used for making them understand why they need information?
- 6. Ask them what is meant by storing? It can be anything.
- 7. Make them understand the purpose of storing with some examples Slide 4
- 8. Ask them whether information can also be stored.
- 9. Help them to understand that information can also be stored by using the examples given in slide 7 and 8
- 10. Ask them to come up with other ways of storing information
- 11. Discuss about their last summer vacation, where did they go, where did they stay etc.
- 12. Take the example of spending time with their grandparents. Ask them what they will do if they have to write a letter to them.
- 13. Another example can be a parent writing a note to the teacher Slide 12
- 14. Discuss the example of making a birthday greeting card by the kids to their mother on her birthday.
- 15. Ask them how they will go about doing it. Will they add pictures or will they draw something or will they paste photographs or will they write some messages?
- 16. Tell them that pictures are also another way of storing information. Pictures can be anything like drawing, painting, photographs etc.
- 17. Discuss the example in Slide 15.
- 18. Ask them how they will draw a map and make them draw a simple map which has landmarks and routes.
- 19. Discuss the second example in Slide 16.
- 20. If you have a theme park map it would be very good to show them when discussing this example.
- 21. Discuss the Slide 17. This talks about family tree.
- 22. Show them how easy it is to find relationships using a family tree
- 23. Another example for family tree is in Slide 20. Various options for ordering Pizza.
- 24. Using the slide you can ask them to order their favorite pizza.
- 25. Slide 21 talk about pictograph.
- 26. Ask them to count and tell the number of dots.
- 27. Show them how easy it was to count by using pictures rather than using their fingers
- 28. Tell them that as kids they started learning to count using pictures and it is the easiest way to learn.
- 29. Slide 23 shows how to do mathematical calculation using pictograph. This slide talks about addition. You can add some more examples as well.
- 30. Summarize the whole session by using the slides 23 and 24
- 31. Distribute the worksheet
